1. Women in crisis "outcasts"

What does the Bible mean by 'rest'?

2. A quest for rest

a. A 'man of standing' (2:1) and 'a noble woman' (2:11-12)

b. A proposal (Ezekiel 16)

2 reasons = fulfil his role as a guardian-redeemer + fulfil his own prayer

3 Kindnesses = a guarantee + protection + grain (lots of it!)

3. There is a redeemer

Why do we have the unnamed redeemer?

4. Seek the redeemer that gives rest

a. We all need a redeemer

Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own... (Titus 2:14)

b. Only Jesus gives us rest

"Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

(Matt 11:28)

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39)

"He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."

(Revelation 21:4)

A surprising end!

Boaz the father of Obed, whose mother was Ruth,
Obed the father of Jesse, and
Jesse the father of King David.
David was the father of Solomon...
...Matthan the father of Jacob, and
Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, and Mary was the mother of
Jesus who is called the Messiah.
(Matthew 1:5-6, 15-16)

c. Our story

We're all outsiders

Jesus becomes the ultimate outsider

But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ... Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household.

(Ephesians 2:13,19)
